Experience these exhibitions in a relaxed, low sensory environment. Suitable for visitors with autism, sensory sensitivity or disability. Exhibition ticket required for 'European Masterpieces'.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

- Everyone who visits QAGOMA is required to provide contact tracing details upon entry, as part of our Queensland Health Department approved COVID- safe plan. For more information, please visit ([qagoma.qld.gov.au/visit/plan-your-visit](http://qagoma.qld.gov.au/visit/plan-your-visit)).
- Unless mandatory as required by QLD Health guidelines, facemasks are optional.
- COVID Safe guidelines are at each entrance. Hand sanitizer is available throughout the galleries.
- Certain items are not allowed in the Gallery. This is for safety of the artworks on display. You cannot bring in food and drinks, large items such as backpacks and sticky items such as putty.
- You can store items that you are not allowed to take into the Gallery in the cloakroom located in the GOMA foyer
- You can take quiet sensory tools/stimming toys into the Gallery
- Please do not touch the artworks/objects on display. This can cause damage.
- Due to room capacity in the Children's Art Centre exhibition, 'The Gifting Tree', we ask that prams are parked in a designated area nearby
- The air-conditioning vents at GOMA are in the floor throughout the building.
- The temperature in GOMA is maintained at 21.5 degrees. This is the best temperature to conserve the artworks. You may like to bring an extra layer of clothing to keep warm.
- Some bathrooms have sensor lights which activate as you enter

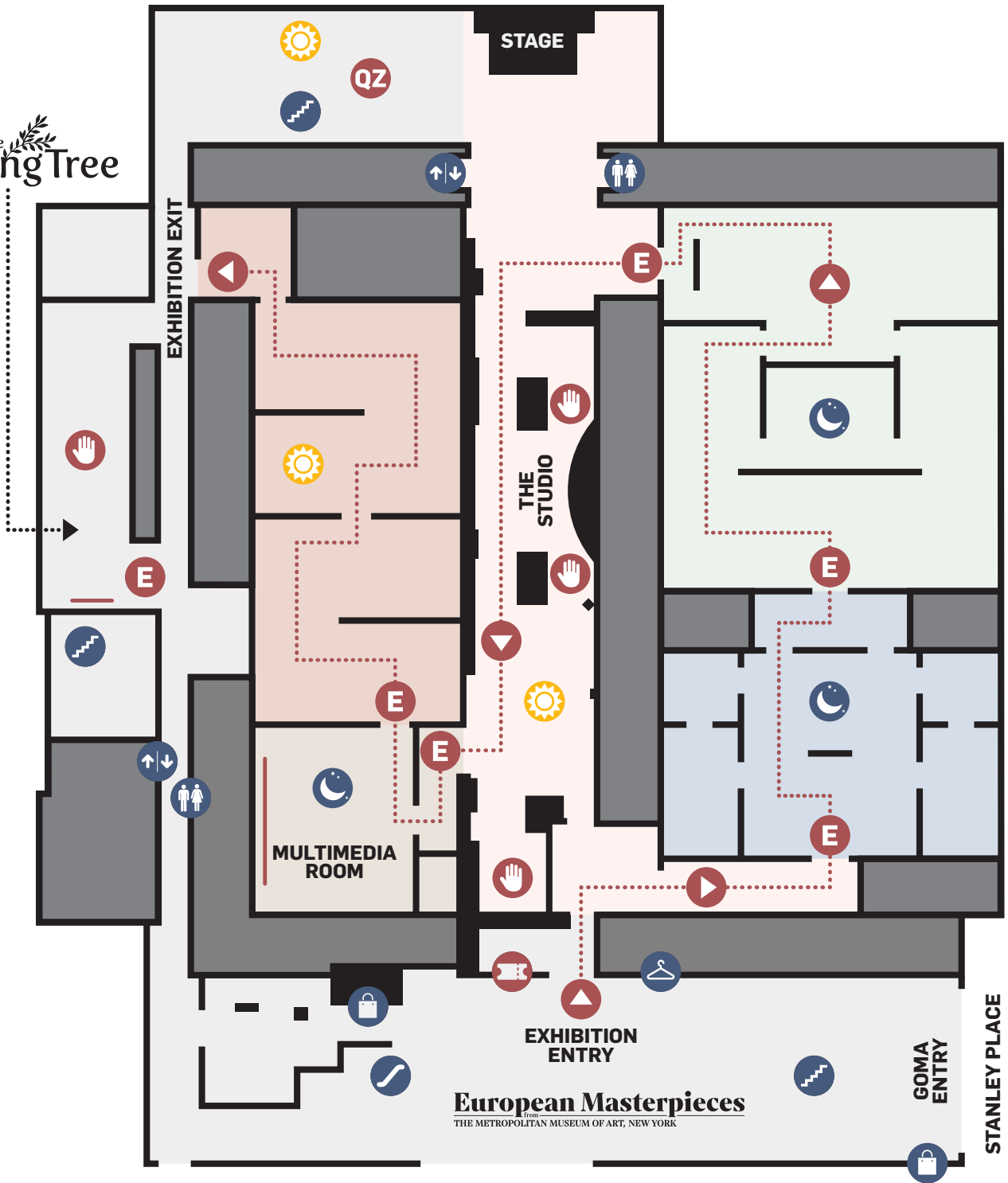
- To assist with visit preparation, view the floor plan on the next page.

- 'The Gifting Tree' is a free interactive Children's Art Centre exhibition and no ticket is required.

### SENSORY EXPERIENCES

- Check the floorplan and look for signs in GOMA on the day
- 'European Masterpieces' has low lighting in the first rooms and brighter lighting in the last rooms
- You can wear a cap and/or sunglasses if you are sensitive to bright light
- In 'European Masterpieces' there is a room with a video playing on a loop every 15 mins. The sound will be lowered.
- You can bring noise cancelling headphones if you are sensitive to sound
- A quiet zone with comfortable seating is located on level 1 near the stage area.
